Shutoff notices, bare pantries, hoping for raises and trying to cut corners are the reality many families face all year long. The thought of Christmas is a sad one, as they try to figure out how to provide a semblance of a celebration for their children.

For the fourth year in a row, the Huber Ridge Area Association is undertaking the goal of providing a wonderful holiday for a neighborhood family. Helping is a simple contribution of your time and/or money.

The Westerville Area Resource Ministry (WARM) will find a family that lives in Huber Ridge, and provide the family's information (ages, sizes and their wish lists) to the HRAA, Inc. In turn, we will raise the funds to provide them with a Christmas they may otherwise not have. We try to raise \$100 per family member, and in the past we have been successful in sponsoring a family with between 5-6 members. ### A Note From The Principal

The school year has gotten off to a great start. Students are already working hard learning new skills and increasing their knowledge. We are excited that we are now a 2-1 school in terms of technology. For every two students, there is one ChromeBook computer for students to use. While these computers do not replace the direct instruction that teachers supply to students, they do enhance student learning greatly and prepare them for their future. Blended Learning is what our end goal is with this new technology. Blended Learning in elementary is simply students learning from the teacher in small groups while other students are doing projects, completing assignments, and learning through different forms of technology.

Having so many pieces of technology and using it effectively would not be possible without support from the community. Westerville City Schools is putting a levy renewal on the ballot this year and I encourage you to learn more about it. Here is an excerpt from the district about the levy:

"This type of levy would not be a new tax to the community because it "substitutes" the March 2012 five-year emergency operating levy when it expires at the end of 2017. Approval of the issue would allow the district to continue collecting the same revenue already on the books. However, unlike other operating issues, the Substitute Emergency Levy allows our schools to receive additional revenue from new construction in the district.

Because the district would be able to receive additional revenue when new homes and businesses are built, a Substitute Emergency Levy can actually stretch the time until the Board would need to ask residents to approve a new operating tax. The committee also noted that even though the State of Ohio recently eliminated property tax rollbacks on new levies, a Substitute Emergency Levy would retain the property tax rollback provision for residents. Allowing the levy to expire and requesting new millage in the future would not."

Again, I encourage you to learn more about it to make an informed vote. Please know that we are always looking for volunteers and would enjoy welcoming the community into the building. 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
